

Texas Homeless Network 2013 Point-In-Time Results


Denton

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Every year HUD requires all Continua to collect data on homelessness at a single point-in-time during the last week in January. The Texas Homeless Network annually assists communities with their Point-in-Time homeless survey preparation and data analysis. This report is a compilation of data collected on the day of January 24, 2013, by members of the Denton County Homeless Coalition.

The "known location" methodology was used by volunteers who surveyed persons found at sites identified by the community to be where those suffering from homelessness are known to congregate. The resulting survey sample is represented by people in homeless situations and persons who are at risk of becoming homeless. The number of survey responses does not represent the total population suffering from homelessness, so estimates are provided in this report. This information is used by local communities in the development of short and long-term strategies to alleviate homelessness.


BASIC DEMOGRAPHICS QUICK REFERENCE OF 238 PEOPLE COUNTED




238 people were accounted for in the survey. 184 adults and 54 children.


RESPONDENT HISTORY






¹ §11302. General definition of homeless individual: (a) In general For purposes of this chapter, the term "homeless" or "homeless individual or homeless person" includes: 1. an individual who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nightlime residence; and 2. an individual who has a primary nightlime residence that is – A. a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations (including welfare hotels, congregate shelters, and transitional housing for the mentally ill); B. an institution that provides a temporary residence for individuals intended to be institutionalized; or C. a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.




EMPLOYMENT AND EDUCATION



- 71.4% of respondents indicated that they were able to work.
- Those that work, average **31.86** hours per week, and their median monthly income was **\$710.00**.
- Median length of unemployment is 4 years.
- 70.5% of respondents report attaining a high school diploma or higher degree in this sample.
- **29.5%** did not graduate high school.

Upon leaving the institution, 44.6% remained homeless.


VETERAN STATISTICS

Respondents indicating having served in the United States Armed Forces: 18.7%


Median length of service was 3 years.


Of those who served in the armed forces, 14.3% were called to active duty as a member of the National Guard or a Reservist.


